Ano-Rectal Surgery Pre-Op & Post-Operative Instructions

BEFORE SURGERY: The Prep

- Clear liquid supper evening prior to surgery
 - Examples: water, clear soup/broth, fruit juice without pulp, soft drinks, popsicles, jello, tea/coffee without milk
- Use one Fleets enema the morning of surgery

Things To Do After Surgery

- Diet as tolerated
- Avoid constipation: increase fluid intake as well as fiber intake
 - Miralax daily if needed for constipation
 - Stool softener (example: Colace)
 - You should be having a bowel movement daily. If you do not have a bowel movement for two days, please call our office at 573-334-3074
 - -
- Sitz baths: 15 minutes three times per day and after bowel movements
 - Fill bath tub or sitz bath tub (available at John's Pharmacy) with just enough lukewarm water to cover the area to soak for the allotted time
 - This helps with hygiene and improves blood flow to the area

Activity

- Resume activity as tolerated. Walk around often (at least every 1-2 hours) and also make yourself cough and deeply breathe frequently. A good rule of thumb is to take 10 deep breaths and cough every time a commercial comes on TV. You may go up and down stairs.
- You may drive once you are no longer taking pain medication and feel as though you can react quickly enough to prevent harm to yourself or others. We ask that you **do not** drive while taking any pain medication prescribed postoperatively
- Restrictions: No lifting anything greater than **20 pounds** for 2 weeks after surgery, unless otherwise noted by your surgeon
- Any FMLA paperwork can be brought to the front desk at our office for completion, or for a work release, please call 573-334-3074 and leave a fax number along with the date that you are planning to return to work. *Please note: work releases will make note of your lifting restriction until you are 4 weeks out from surgery*

Excessive Bleeding

- Some bleeding after rectal surgery is normal, especially after bowel movements.
- If you have bleeding that does not stop, please call our office at 573-334-3074 or go to the Emergency Department
